1. Preface

2. Objectives of Feedback Process

- To determine the gap analysis of the programme.
- To ascertain the need for the revision of the course content.
- To develop the syllabus as per industrial and societal needs.
- To strengthen the curriculum as per recent advances in technology.
- To incorporate the courses having focus on employability, entrepreneurship and skill development.

3. Feedback Analysis

a) Student Feedback:

Himachal Pradesh University has collected feedback of students in 2021-22, a total of feedback was taken from students on different aspects of course objective, course outcomes, study material, elective courses, usefulness of curriculum towards research, innovation, skill development, employability and introduction of new courses. 


Figure 1: Representation of responses received from students for academic (Session 2021-22)

Analysis of Responses: A total of 450 respondents has given their feedback. For Course objectives and outcomes 155 responded as an excellent, 240 good, 48 as average and 7 below average. For books and study material 151 responded as excellent, 229 as good, 61 as average and 9 below average. For elective/ optional 117 responded as excellent, 244 as good, 69 as average and 20 below average. For course duration 133 responded as excellent, 240 as good, 68 as average and 9 below average. For research and innovation 122 responded as excellent, 215 as good, 85 as average and 6 below average. For skill development 126 responded as excellent, 216 as good, 83 as average and 25 below average.

b) Teacher's Feedback:

The feedback which is received from the teachers revealed the validity and adequacy of the syllabus. 


Figure 2: Representation of responses received from Teachers for academic (Session 2021-22)




Figure 3.1: Representation of responses received from Teachers for academic (Session 2021-22)

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


Figure 3.2: Representation of responses received from Teachers for academic (Session 2021-22)




Figure 4: Representation of responses received from Employers for academic (Session 2021-22)
