The office of the Dean Students' Welfare is basically meant for carrying out activities pertaining to the general welfare of the students. The aims and objectives are to provide all facilities that are necessary for the overall development and general welfare of the students such as admission of students to various courses under cultural quota, organizing co-curricular and cultural activities, providing and managing travel concessions for students to go to their home towns and on educational tours, to participate in cultural or sports events within and outside the state.

In addition, the genuine requests of students for financial help are entertained and considered on merit. Financial Aid to 28 students was provided @ Rs. 2,000/- P.A. for the session 2017-18. Besides this the medical assistance of Rs. 1,00,000/- was provided to 01 student. Verification of Post matric scholarship scheme to all the eligible students of SC/ST/OBC/IRDP have been made.

The Dean Students' Welfare is also the Chief Advisor to Foreign students. International Student's Welfare Wing is headed by the Director to look into the issues related

to Foreign students. Meetings are held from time to time with the Foreign Students studying in H.P. University to extend them help/guidance in the field of education and also to solve their problems. The enrolment of the Foreign Students i.e. PG-16 Nos. has been made for the session 2018-19.

Common Room facilities are provided where the students may utilize their Indoor Games such as Carom board, Chess, Table Tennis etc. The office is also planning to add more Indoor Games to the Common Room and a new Table Tennis Table has been provided in the T.T. Room. However, there is no facility for indoor games like Badminton, Gymnastic activities etc. in the Campus.

Identity Cards were issued to fresh students who have been admitted in First Semester in teaching departments of the Campus.

The Annual Prize Distribution Function of the students who excelled in academic, sports and cultural activities is yet to be held.

Apart from this, the other activities such as two days sensitization/awareness programme on Drug Demand Reduction was organised on 27th & 28th March, 2019 and an oration contest on the eve of International Women Day was organized on 08/03/2019 on the topic Indian Women – Past, Present and Future

(i) Curricular Aspects.	The curricular received from UGC time to time for different courses and passed by different bodies in the University is strictly adopted in ICDEOL. Keeping in view the geographical conditions of the H.P. the students enrolled in ICDEOL are provided the study material through postal services well in time. Further, for their convenience examination centres are created nearest to their native places.
(ii) Teaching-Learning & Evaluation:	Assignments & ESE Conduct PCP's in respect of each course regularly and Academic doubts of the learners are cleared. Assignments are uploaded on the website and after evaluation same are sent back to the students for improvement. Evaluation of assignments, quiz competition, seminars, oratorical competitions and co-curricular activities are organized.
(iii) Research, Consultancy & Extension:	The faculty members of ICDEOL carry out research work by publishing their papers in National/International journal of repute. Also some of the faculty members have Major/Minor research projects funded by different Govt. agencies. Faculty also guided Ph.D. Scholars for preparing synopsis and tools construction. Making students aware and sensitive about community work and social issues during PCP's.
(iv) Infrastructure and Learning Resources	Establishment of 02 Smart Class rooms ICT facility are functional in the ICDEOL and 01 Language Lab has been established and to make it fully equipped, the process is going on. Library and Computer Lab also fulfilled the requirements of the learners. Student Grievance Cell is also functional to sort out the problems of the students.
(v) Student support and Progression	Study materials are provided to students and PCP are organized for the students and queries of the students are resolved through Emails/telephonically by the faculty members. All the Information's are uploaded on the ICDEOL's website from time to time in order to facilitate the students.

Faculty members are given opportunity to attend faculty development programme like ASC's Orientation programme, lecture series and refresher course, Seminars, workshops etc. Various committees have been constituted to follow the UGC guidelines time to time.

Ever since the Post -Graduate Centre of the University in Shimla was made a nucleus for setting up the Himachal Pradesh University Library in 1972, there has been manifold increase in the size to its collection and demand of its services. Its collection has since then grown from a meager 15000 to more than 232884 books (upto 30.06.2019) and journals. The library functions for 11 hours on working days and for 7 hours on Sundays/holidays. It is housed in a multi storied building designed to house the functions of a modern University Library.

Users can access full text journals. This facility is very popular among Students, Research scholar and faculty of the University. Library is trying to procure more e-journals from INFLIBNET under this programme. So far 8500+ E-Journals are accessible to the readers under the above programme.

4. STEPS TAKEN BY THE COLLEGE TO IMPROVE THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION WITH REGARD TO FOLLOWING QUALITY PARAMETERS OF NAAC FOR THE COLLEGE:

- (i) **Curricular Aspects:** The quality enhancement measures were undertaken and this has shown the increase in the number of the students in the college. The College applied for the re-accreditation and has been accredited Grade 'B' by NAAC.
- (ii) **Teaching-Learning & Evaluation:** The college is a perfect place for learning since it is located far away from the town and is free from all kinds of disturbances and outside interference. Its campus is neat and clean. The teachers teach with the help of audio-visual teaching aids. The instructions imparted to the students are followed by them throughout the session. The students are encouraged and prepared to participate in the various Inter-College competitions such as debate, declamations, acting (theatrical activities), and folk-dances, poster-making, slogan writing, poetic symposiums and sports events. The teaching and evaluation aspects are met as main focus with the latest trends.
- (iii) **Research, Consultancy & Extension:** The research and extension activities of the college help in the qualitative aspects of teaching. The teachers get a boost to their academic spirit by going deep into the various aspects of the subject they teach. The teaching faculty is encouraged to participate in seminars and conferences to improve their research component. 

4. Steps taken by the Institute/Department/ College/ to improve the quality of Education

with regard to following quality parameters of NAAC for the College: -

Curricular Aspects:

The Institution follows the course curriculum developed by the affiliating HP University Shimla. Interdisciplinary approach is adopted so as to enable students to have access to curricular and co-curricular opportunities for enhancing academic acumen, employability and entrepreneurial skills. UGC based CBCS was implemented in 2016 with the introduction of skill enhancement courses which are subject specific. The Generic Elective Courses (GEC's) are also offered in each subject. These GE Courses are designed to cater to the regional and local needs of the students but now the annual system has been re- introduced in place of semester system of UGC (CBCS) from the academic session 2018-19. Self financing and B.Voc. Courses have been started in the college for the students to have an access to employment oriented education. However the college could not show any PO, PSO and CO related documentation. The college has organized only limited number of seminars and special lectures on cross cutting issues relevant to gender, environment and sustainability, human values and professional ethics. Apart from the regular academic activities, the institution tries to ensure participation of students in varied activities such as NSS, NCC, Rangers & Rovers to integrate social human values and professional ethics. Students of self financed courses are given exposure through industrial training and educational trips. The institution is sensitive towards environment and its sustainability.

2. Teaching-learning and Evaluation:

There is a mechanism in the college to identify advanced and slow learners. Advanced learners are counseled and guided regarding the best utilization of library resources. Teachers also guide these students who express a desire to appear in competitive examinations. They are also given opportunities to develop their

creativity by participating and organizing intercollegiate as well as national level technical symposiums. Effective academic streaming and follow up is not properly documented. Semester toppers and university rank holders are rewarded with certificates and cash prizes by the institution. Extra classes are organized to clarify doubts and re-explaining of critical topics to improve the performance of slow learners. Appropriate counseling and additional efforts of the teachers motivate slow learners to attend the classes regularly. The method of attempting question paper is also discussed with them. The college with assistance of its staff (teaching / non teaching) tries to collect information regarding the students who are at the risk of drop out and as such the drop out ratio has been minimised. The institution also provides fee concession / scholarships to poor and meritorious students and also make them aware about various government welfare schemes. Sometimes, the faculty acts as a counselor as well as a mentor. The needy students are provided books from the book bank and the staff personally also helps the students. Conventional teaching-learning methods are mostly adopted by the faculty members with the use of ICT upto some extent. Experiential learning and problem solving methods are not visible. Teaching plans are prepared to adhere with academic calendar which includes all the components such as assignments, class tests, attendance, mid term tests and end term tests as per the guidelines of Himachal Pradesh University. For under graduate classes, End Semester Examination (ESE) carries 70% marks for each subject and Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) in a particular subject carries 30% marks. The students have to take 35% in marks in both the components i.e. ESE and CCA separately and aggregate 45% to become eligible to be declared pass in a course. For the post graduate classes ESE carries 80 % marks and CCA carries 20% marks. Distribution of internal assessment marks for UG classes is-15 marks for house examination, 10 marks for assignments/seminars and 05 marks for attendance. Pre-Examination system is online and transparent which has minimised the students grievances related with examinations. The Program Outcomes are published in the Departmental files, College Website and college prospectus but staff and students need orientation about their usefulness in the learning process. The institution and the individual teachers use conventional assessment/evaluation strategies to measure the performance of students.

3. Research, Consultancy and Extension

The Institution has established a polyhouse in the campus in 2011 to improve the technical skill of students related with cultivation of ornamental plants and vegetables. The college has also developed a vermi-compost plant to provide practical knowledge to students about disposal of organic waste. The garbage of the whole campus including hostels is used as raw material for making compost. It provides manure to polyhouse and flower beds of the college, helping in keeping the campus clean. The NSS activities are controlled and co-ordinated by the NSS Coordinator of the affiliating University. In this college there are two units of NSS headed by two Program officers to run the NSS activities throughout the year. A Number of activities are undertaken during the full academic session and an Annual Camp is organized every year. Activities during the camp include polio eradication campaigns, blood donations, tree plantations, medical camps, awareness programs, attending old age homes, attending to the needs of the village such as road construction, cleaning of surroundings, etc. NSS also conducts some programs in coordination with NGOs and Health Educators. The institution has NCC wings of both Army and Navy, having units of both boys and girls. NCC activities are coordinated by the Commanding Officer of the Army and at the college level there are three teachers as Associated NCC Officers

(ANOs) to carry out the activities of NCC. Both boys and girls are enrolled in the

NCC units. A number of activities are organized including the participation of the cadets in various programs organized by the college and government. Students take part in camps regularly and also render support during the Republic Day celebrations. Rovers and Rangers units are also very active. About hundred students of the college are enrolled as Rovers and Rangers. The activities are organized mainly as per the directions of the Directorate of Higher Education. Regular camps are organized and students extend their services to district administration, as and when required. The Alumni Association of the college (OSA) organizes a number of activities such as Health Checkup Camps, Blood Grouping, Annual Conference, Legal Literacy Camp, etc. The college has not documented any impact study of these programs in the form of adoption of villages in the nearby community.

4. Infrastructure and Learning Resources

There are sufficient number of Classrooms, Seminar Halls and Laboratories in the institution. Classrooms are Wi-Fi enabled and seminar Halls are well equipped with technology to deliver the lectures. Laboratories also have internet access facility and have required apparatus for conducting practicals. There is also a provision of IT Lab where the students can learn the IT skills. BBA, BCA, PGDCA, B.Voc. and Physics lab also have sufficient number of computers for conducting practicals. Printers, Scanners, Projectors and Photocopier machines are also available for smooth functioning of the department. The college has a play ground, sufficient for conducting various sports activities throughout the year. A yoga centre is also being run in the campus for teachers and students. Facilities are also available for indoor games like TT, Chess, Caromboard etc. The college also has enough space for preparations of cultural activities in the department of Music. Cemented Basket ball court seems abandoned. The college library is partially automated and is using Integrated Library Management System SOUL 2.0 Software. The OPAC module has search facility with minimum information for each item including Author, Title, Corporate body, Subject, Class number, Accession number, Publisher etc. Students and teachers are allowed to use library resources and get necessary references. The college has a stocked library and a periodical/reading section. The library subscribes 13 newspapers, 27 Magazines and 8 Journals. Besides, the college library is equipped with INFLIBNET technology, which provides the students a chance to access E-Books and E- Journals through the internet. Students of the college are availing the INFLIBNET facility. A separate cabin of 6 Computers and 4 Net-Books with Wi-Fi connectivity and Reprographic facilities is also available in the Library for students and teachers. The Library has an open access system where the students and teachers can get access to study material. The library has 33,566 Books in stock in different subjects and also has books on Pahari Culture written by Pahari writers. There is an IT Lab in the new building having Twenty Eight computers, One Projector and one multifunctional printer. There is a separate computer lab in the department of Geography having five terminals with printing facility. The lab in the Physics department has 12 computers. There are separate labs for the students of BCA and PGDCA having 28 and 20 computers respectively. There is a combined Computer Lab for the Students of BBA, BTA and Bio-Technology having ten computers. Each computer lab is provided with internet facility. The whole campus of the institution is Wi-Fi enabled. There are different committees for the repair and maintenance of the institution. The time-table of the institution is framed in such a way that all the class rooms, labs, IT lab, Conference Hall, Multi-Purpose Hall, theatre Class-rooms, Sports Complex and grounds are properly utilized. Boys and Girls hostel are available.

5. Student Support and Progression

Central students college association (CSCA) works in tandem with the college authorities and in the year 2013-14, a meeting with CSCA members was held to

discuss various issues related to CBCS system implementation and developmental works in the institution. The demands of the CSCA were taken seriously and all the loopholes were taken care of. In the year 2014-15 five meetings with CSCA members were held to discuss various issues related to the institution like pending results and implementation of proper academic calendar. The issues were taken seriously and sorted out by communicating with HPU. The demands related to developmental works were also fulfilled. Participation of the students through CSCA is encouraged. Different activities and events such as Swachhta Drive, Voter Awareness Camps, NSS, NCC, Rovers and Rangers, Eco Club activities, Prize Distribution Function etc. were organised effectively by associating CSCA. Four meetings were held with CSCA in the year 2015-16. All the issues discussed in these meetings were fulfilled upto the satisfaction of the students. In the year 2016-17 CSCA members participated in various activities like Swachhta Drive, Voter Awareness etc. All the demands of CSCA like maintenance of hygiene in the college canteen, proper functioning of CCTV cameras were taken care of. In the year 2017-18 also CSCA actively participated in all the college functions and awareness drives thereby helping in proper functioning of the college. Four meetings were held with CSCA during the year. The institution has a registered alumni association - Old Student Association (OSA) of Government College Bilaspur, HP. Regular meetings are organized to have collaboration with the alumni of the college. The association sponsors scholarships to the meritorious and poor students and is actively involved in conducting various activities in the institution such as: Blood Donation Camp, Health Checkup Camps, Legal Awareness Camp, Infrastructural Development works etc.

6. Governance and Leadership

The college has been creating a perfect learning environment which encourages the students to make maximum use of their potential in tune with the vision and mission of the institution. It also encourages students to participate in extracurricular activities which contribute to the development of their social consciousness, empathy and interpersonal communication. It also provides academic facilities to the teachers to enable them to use technology driven tools and adopt effective methods for imparting education. Department of Higher Education headed by Secretary Education and Directorate of Higher Education are the apex bodies from where policies, programmes and directions pertaining to education are issued and institute implements them accordingly. The decision making process of the college is transparent and fair. The college advisory committee and CSCA advisory committee plays pivotal role in matters related to the welfare of the students. The RUSA cell of the college is constituted to make decisions regarding effective implementation of newly introduced CBCS and utilization of RUSA Grant. The various activities and plans in the institution are formulated as per the guidelines of the Department of Higher Education, affiliating university and also in accordance with vision and mission of the institution and also based upon the feedback and suggestions recorded in the minute registers of meetings with stakeholders like students of the college, CSCA, Old Students Association (OSA), teachers and members of Parent Teachers Association (PTA), Higher Education Institute Society (HEIS). Efforts are always made to effectively implement and execute all the plans and decisions recorded in the minute registers of the meetings held in the college keeping in view the welfare of the students and overall growth of the institution.

The administration values the opinion of the public and makes specific efforts to reach out to public and interact with them whenever and wherever possible. The college also makes available important information in the website and notice boards. Policies and plans are made according to needs of the institution and valuable inputs which are given by various stakeholders. CSCA, Parents Teachers Association,

Teachers, Office Staff and Alumni Associations are always involved in planning and decision making process. Feedback, valuable inputs, reports of various committees or suggestions of advisory committee and stakeholders are thoroughly discussed, analyzed and recorded in the meetings with stakeholders and the staff council and thus policies and plans are made and executed accordingly. Stakeholders extend full support to the college in this endeavour. Various bodies and committees that exist in the college make it a point that the academic calendar get implemented in a time bound manner. The decisions so taken in various meetings are documented in a proper manner and effective steps are taken to implement the decisions in to reality at ground level. Teachers of the institution are continuously encouraged to attend refresher courses, workshops, orientation programs, seminars and Conferences organized by different Universities and Institutions. Teachers are also motivated for applying major research projects from UGC and other funding agencies as well as for carrying out minor research projects especially focusing on local issues and problems. Freshly recruited teachers undergo Induction training programs at State Council for Education Research and Training (SCERT) Solan. The institution itself also conducts interactive sessions, meetings, seminars to enhance the professional development of teaching and non teaching staff of the college. ICT training is also provided to the staff. Nonteaching staff also attends different training programs conducted by the govt. agencies from time to time. Faculty appointments prior to 2004 are eligible for pension benefits on retirement. Faculty after 2004 are covered under New Pension Scheme. GPF, gratuity and leave encashment are availed by retiring faculty as per University norms. Medical reimbursement, medical allowance to teaching and non-teaching staff as per the provisions approved by Govt. of H.P. The welfare measures and benefits pertaining to the staff member both teaching and non-teaching working under HEIS are as per the decisions of the said body. Performance Appraisal of the teachers of the college is on the basis of API based PBAS of UGC Regulations 2009. The performance appraisal of non teaching staff is also done through ACRs based on their performance on various parameters indicated in ACR form. The APIs/ACRs are submitted to the higher authorities with the remarks of the Principal. On the basis of evaluation of APIs, ACRs by Departmental Promotional Committee the higher scales and promotions are provided to the various stakeholders under career advancement scheme. The decisions regarding career advancements are conveyed through notifications issued by government from time to time. After reviewing the self appraisal and the performance, the stakeholders are accordingly guided for improvement. The college has healthy practice of settlement of funds within a stipulated period of time. Transparency and Financial integrity is maintained at every level in the college Internal audit The purchase committee, internal audit committee and bursar of the college keeps check on each and every payment of bills from the funds of different heads of the college. External audit The external audit of government funds is done by the Local Audit committee/office of the Accountant General of Himachal Pradesh. The audit of HEIS funds and the funds of Self-financed Courses is done through registered Chartered Accountant.

The college follows the strategies for mobilisation of funds and optimal utilization of resources as directed by Govt. of H.P. The major fund providing agencies are UGC, H.P. University, H.P. Govt., RUSA grants, Self-Financing Courses (HEIS) and different student funds. The funds received are utilized to create better infrastructural facilities and academic environment. For major expenses, approval from Government is taken after recommendation from Staff Council Committees. The IQAC is actively functioning with a thrust on academic, co-academic and administrative excellence. IQAC has been made an integral part of the institution for quality improvement and sustenance and making efforts to develop a system of conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of the college.

The IQAC has made some contribution in formulating and implementing the strategies for quality improvement in the college and is also helping in achieving academic and co-academic excellence. The IQAC is also doing efforts to create, promote and encourage the kind of atmosphere conducive to carry out the different activities in the college in a phased manner. The college has made some incremental improvements in almost all areas in the post accreditation of second cycle in 2013. Employment oriented, Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) degree course in two streams i.e. Retail Management and Hospitality & Tourism has been started in the college from the academic session 2017-18. With the advent of this course, student visibility has increased in the development sector and industries. As an outcome of the Students' feedback regarding infrastructure, mapping of college facilities has been done and classrooms, common rooms, hostels and washrooms have been renovated. The provisions for wireless connectivity (Wi-Fi), more books in the library, napkin vending machines in the girls toilets has been done in the campus. Multipurpose hall has been constructed for pursuing co-curricular and extra-curricular activities by the students.

7. Innovative Practices

The College has a zero tolerance policy towards sexual Harassment of Women at workplace sexual and any such transgression. The college is committed to provide a safe and conducive work and academic environment to students and its employees and is extremely alert to matters pertaining to any kind of harassment and gender sensitivity. Anti-ragging Committee is formed as per the U.G.C. guidelines. The college has consistently strived to address contemporary issues like gender, women concerns, safety and security etc. through its activities in the campus. Regular counselling of girl students is being done by the Principal and the Faculty members in classrooms/tutorials related to their issues of safety like self-defence, cyber-crime, police training and so on. The CCTV cameras have been installed in both the campuses to check and ensure security and safety of girls. There are two girls common rooms (one in old campus and one in new campus) in the college. There are separate toilets for gents, teaching staff and students. Girls toilets in the two common rooms and girls hostel, have been equipped with sanitary napkin vending machines and incinerators to promote the personal hygiene among the college girls. There is one hostel each for boys and girls where spacious Common rooms are available. The waste material in college is segregated into biodegradable and non-biodegradable wastes, and as toxic and non-toxic wastes in the laboratories. Indiscriminate use of chemicals is discouraged during practical classes and college does not have permission to use radioactive substances in its laboratories. The College adopts the policy of Reduce, Recycle and Reuse (3Rs). Organic floriculture is done on campus to sensitize students on sustainable

floricultural/agricultural practices. The college has undertaken an initiative of 'Green Campus' aimed at transformation of campus from dependency to sustainability with respect to water resources. The Rain Water Harvesting project is an attempt in this direction. The college observes and exercises the Green practices like-use of public transport for transportation, under Green landscaping plantation of trees and plants, online filing of examination forms, etc. Various activities such as tree plantation programmes, slogan writing, poster making competitions, afforestation drives, vanamahotsava, seminars and micro literacy camps etc. are also organised in the college. National festivals and birth/death anniversaries of great Indian personalities are celebrated. The expenditure incurred are properly scrutinized by local audit agency of H.P. Govt., HPAG Shimla and authorized Chartered Accountant (CA). The College also ensures transparency regarding financial management and resource mobilization through the Bursar and the Head of the Institution. The financial details and documents are properly scrutinized and

maintained.

College: -

Curricular Aspects:

The Institution follows the course curriculum developed by the affiliating HP University Shimla. Interdisciplinary approach is adopted so as to enable students to have access to curricular and co-curricular opportunities for enhancing academic acumen, employability and entrepreneurial skills. UGC based CBCS was implemented in 2016 with the introduction of skill enhancement courses which are subject specific. The Generic Elective Courses (GEC's) are also offered in each subject. These GE Courses are designed to cater to the regional and local needs of the students but now the annual system has been re- introduced in place of semester system of UGC (CBCS) from the academic session 2018-19. Self financing and B.Voc. Courses have been started in the college for the students to have an access to employment oriented education. However the college could not show any PO, PSO and CO related documentation. The college has organized only limited number of seminars and special lectures on cross cutting issues relevant to gender, environment and sustainability, human values and professional ethics. Apart from the regular academic activities, the institution tries to ensure participation of students in varied activities such as NSS, NCC, Rangers & Rovers to integrate social human values and professional ethics. Students of self financed courses are given exposure through industrial training and educational trips. The institution is sensitive towards environment and its sustainability.

2. Teaching-learning and Evaluation:

There is a mechanism in the college to identify advanced and slow learners. Advanced learners are counseled and guided regarding the best utilization of library resources. Teachers also guide these students who express a desire to appear in competitive examinations. They are also given opportunities to develop their creativity by participating and organizing intercollegiate as well as national level technical symposiums. Effective academic streaming and follow up is not properly documented. Semester toppers and university rank holders are rewarded with certificates and cash prizes by the institution. Extra classes are organized to clarify doubts and re-explaining of critical topics to improve the performance of slow learners. Appropriate counseling and additional efforts of the teachers motivate slow learners to attend the classes regularly. The method of attempting question paper is also discussed with them. The college with assistance of its staff (teaching / non teaching) tries to collect information regarding the students who are at the risk of drop out and as such the drop out ratio has been minimised. The institution also

provides fee concession / scholarships to poor and meritorious students and also make them aware about various government welfare schemes. Sometimes, the faculty acts as a counselor as well as a mentor. The needy students are provided books from the book bank and the staff personally also helps the students. Conventional teaching-learning methods are mostly adopted by the faculty members with the use of ICT upto some extent. Experiential learning and problem solving methods are not visible. Teaching plans are prepared to adhere with academic calendar which includes all the components such as assignments, class tests, attendance, mid term tests and end term tests as per the guidelines of Himachal Pradesh University. For under graduate classes, End Semester Examination (ESE) carries 70% marks for each subject and Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) in a particular subject carries 30% marks. The students have to take 35% in marks in both the components i.e. ESE and CCA separately and aggregate 45% to become eligible to be declared pass in a course. For the post graduate classes ESE carries 80 % marks and CCA carries 20% marks. Distribution of internal assessment marks for UG classes is-15 marks for house examination, 10 marks for assignments/seminars and 05 marks for attendance. Pre-Examination system is online and transparent which has minimised the students grievances related with examinations. The Program Outcomes are published in the Departmental files, College Website and college prospectus but staff and students need orientation about their usefulness in the learning process. The institution and the individual teachers use conventional assessment/evaluation strategies to measure the performance of students.

3. Research, Consultancy and Extension

The Institution has established a polyhouse in the campus in 2011 to improve the technical skill of students related with cultivation of ornamental plants and vegetables. The college has also developed a vermi-compost plant to provide practical knowledge to students about disposal of organic waste. The garbage of the whole campus including hostels is used as raw material for making compost. It provides manure to polyhouse and flower beds of the college, helping in keeping the campus clean. The NSS activities are controlled and co-ordinated by the NSS Coordinator of the affiliating University. In this college there are two units of NSS headed by two Program officers to run the NSS activities throughout the year. A Number of activities are undertaken during the full academic session and an Annual Camp is organized every year. Activities during the camp include polio eradication campaigns, blood donations, tree plantations, medical camps, awareness programs, attending old age homes, attending to the needs of the village such as road construction, cleaning of surroundings, etc. NSS also conducts some programs in coordination with NGOs and Health Educators. The institution has NCC wings of both Army and Navy, having units of both boys and girls. NCC activities are coordinated by the Commanding Officer of the Army and at the college level there are three teachers as Associated NCC Officers

(ANOs) to carry out the activities of NCC. Both boys and girls are enrolled in the NCC units. A number of activities are organized including the participation of the cadets in various programs organized by the college and government. Students take part in camps regularly and also render support during the Republic Day celebrations. Rovers and Rangers units are also very active. About hundred students of the college are enrolled as Rovers and Rangers. The activities are organized mainly as per the directions of the Directorate of Higher Education. Regular camps are organized and students extend their services to district administration, as and when required. The Alumni Association of the college (OSA) organizes a number of activities such as Health Checkup Camps, Blood Grouping, Annual Conference, Legal Literacy Camp, etc. The college has not documented any impact study of these

programs in the form of adoption of villages in the nearby community.

4. Infrastructure and Learning Resources

There are sufficient number of Classrooms, Seminar Halls and Laboratories in the institution. Classrooms are Wi-Fi enabled and seminar Halls are well equipped with technology to deliver the lectures. Laboratories also have internet access facility and have required apparatus for conducting practicals. There is also a provision of IT Lab where the students can learn the IT skills. BBA, BCA, PGDCA, B.Voc. and Physics lab also have sufficient number of computers for conducting practicals. Printers, Scanners, Projectors and Photocopier machines are also available for smooth functioning of the department. The college has a play ground, sufficient for conducting various sports activities throughout the year. A yoga centre is also being run in the campus for teachers and students. Facilities are also available for indoor games like TT, Chess, Caromboard etc. The college also has enough space for preparations of cultural activities in the department of Music. Cemented Basket ball court seems abandoned. The college library is partially automated and is using Integrated Library Management System SOUL 2.0 Software. The OPAC module has search facility with minimum information for each item including Author, Title, Corporate body, Subject, Class number, Accession number, Publisher etc. Students and teachers are allowed to use library resources and get necessary references. The college has a stocked library and a periodical/reading section. The library subscribes 13 newspapers, 27 Magazines and 8 Journals. Besides, the college library is equipped with INFLIBNET technology, which provides the students a chance to access E-Books and E- Journals through the internet. Students of the college are availing the INFLIBNET facility. A separate cabin of 6 Computers and 4 Net-Books with Wi-Fi connectivity and Reprographic facilities is also available in the Library for students and teachers. The Library has an open access system where the students and teachers can get access to study material. The library has 33,566 Books in stock in different subjects and also has books on Pahari Culture written by Pahari writers. There is an IT Lab in the new building having Twenty Eight computers, One Projector and one multifunctional printer. There is a separate computer lab in the department of Geography having five terminals with printing facility. The lab in the Physics department has 12 computers. There are separate labs for the students of BCA and PGDCA having 28 and 20 computers respectively. There is a combined Computer Lab for the Students of BBA, BTA and Bio-Technology having ten computers. Each computer lab is provided with internet facility. The whole campus of the institution is Wi-Fi enabled. There are different committees for the repair and maintenance of the institution. The time-table of the institution is framed in such a way that all the class rooms, labs, IT lab, Conference Hall, Multi-Purpose Hall, theatre Class-rooms, Sports Complex and grounds are properly utilized. Boys and Girls hostel are available.

5. Student Support and Progression

Central students college association (CSCA) works in tandem with the college authorities and in the year 2013-14, a meeting with CSCA members was held to discuss various issues related to CBCS system implementation and developmental works in the institution. The demands of the CSCA were taken seriously and all the loopholes were taken care of. In the year 2014-15 five meetings with CSCA members were held to discuss various issues related to the institution like pending results and implementation of proper academic calendar. The issues were taken seriously and sorted out by communicating with HPU. The demands related to developmental works were also fulfilled. Participation of the students through CSCA is encouraged. Different activities and events such as Swachhta Drive, Voter Awareness Camps, NSS, NCC, Rovers and Rangers, Eco Club activities, Prize Distribution Function etc. were organised effectively by associating CSCA. Four

meetings were held with CSCA in the year 2015-16. All the issues discussed in these meetings were fulfilled upto the satisfaction of the students. In the year 2016-17 CSCA members participated in various activities like Swachhta Drive, Voter Awareness etc. All the demands of CSCA like maintenance of hygiene in the college canteen, proper functioning of CCTV cameras were taken care of. In the year 2017-18 also CSCA actively participated in all the college functions and awareness drives thereby helping in proper functioning of the college. Four meetings were held with CSCA during the year. The institution has a registered alumni association - Old Student Association (OSA) of Government College Bilaspur, HP. Regular meetings are organized to have collaboration with the alumni of the college. The association sponsors scholarships to the meritorious and poor students and is actively involved in conducting various activities in the institution such as: Blood Donation Camp, Health Checkup Camps, Legal Awareness Camp, Infrastructural Development works etc.

6. Governance and Leadership

The college has been Creating a perfect learning environment which encourages the students to make maximum use of their potential in tune with the vision and mission of the institution. It also encourages students to participate in extracurricular activities which contribute to the development of their social consciousness, empathy and interpersonal communication. It also provides academic facilities to the teachers to enable them to use technology driven tools and adopt effective methods for imparting education. Department of Higher education headed by Secretary Education and Directorate of Higher Education are the apex bodies from where policies, programmes and directions pertaining to education are issued and institute implements them accordingly. The decision making process of the college is transparent and fair. The college advisory committee and CSCA advisory committee plays pivotal role in matters related to the welfare of the students. The RUSA cell of the college is constituted to make decisions regarding effective implementation of newly introduced CBCS and utilization of RUSA Grant. The various activities and plans in the institution are formulated as per the guidelines of the Department of Higher Education, affiliating university and also in accordance with vision and mission of the institution and also based upon the feedback and suggestions recorded in the minute registers of meetings with stakeholders like students of the college, CSCA, Old Students Association (OSA), teachers and members of Parent Teachers Association (PTA), Higher Education Institute Society (HEIS). Efforts are always made to effectively implement and execute all the plans and decisions recorded in the minute registers of the meetings held in the college keeping in view the welfare of the students and overall growth of the institution.

The administration values the opinion of the public and makes specific efforts to reach out to public and interact with them whenever and wherever possible. The college also makes available important information in the website and notice boards. Policies and plans are made according to needs of the institution and valuable inputs which are given by various stakeholders. CSCA, Parents Teachers Association, Teachers, Office Staff and Alumni Associations are always involved in planning and decision making process. Feedback, valuable inputs, reports of various committees or suggestions of advisory committee and stakeholders are thoroughly discussed, analyzed and recorded in the meetings with stakeholders and the staff council and thus policies and plans are made and executed accordingly. Stakeholders extend full support to the college in this endeavour. Various bodies and committees that exist in the college make it a point that the academic calendar get implemented in a time bound manner. The decisions so taken in various meetings are documented in a proper manner and effective steps are taken to implement the decisions in to reality at ground level. Teachers of the institution are continuously encouraged to attend

refresher courses, workshops, orientation programs, seminars and Conferences organized by different Universities and Institutions. Teachers are also motivated for applying major research projects from UGC and other funding agencies as well as for carrying out minor research projects especially focusing on local issues and problems. Freshly recruited teachers undergo Induction training programs at State Council for Education Research and Training (SCERT) Solan. The institution itself also conducts interactive sessions, meetings, seminars to enhance the professional development of teaching and non-teaching staff of the college. ICT training is also provided to the staff. Non-teaching staff also attends different training programs conducted by the govt. agencies from time to time. Faculty appointments prior to 2004 are eligible for pension benefits on retirement. Faculty after 2004 are covered under New Pension Scheme. GPF, gratuity and leave encashment are availed by retiring faculty as per University norms. Medical reimbursement, medical allowance to teaching and non-teaching staff as per the provisions approved by Govt. of H.P. The welfare measures and benefits pertaining to the staff member both teaching and non-teaching working under HEIS are as per the decisions of the said body. Performance Appraisal of the teachers of the college is on the basis of API based PBAS of UGC Regulations 2009. The performance appraisal of non-teaching staff is also done through ACRs based on their performance on various parameters indicated in ACR form. The APIs/ACRs are submitted to the higher authorities with the remarks of the Principal. On the basis of evaluation of APIs, ACRs by Departmental Promotional Committee the higher scales and promotions are provided to the various stakeholders under career advancement scheme. The decisions regarding career advancements are conveyed through notifications issued by government from time to time. After reviewing the self-appraisal and the performance, the stakeholders are accordingly guided for improvement. The college has healthy practice of settlement of funds within a stipulated period of time. Transparency and Financial integrity is maintained at every level in the college. Internal audit: The purchase committee, internal audit committee and bursar of the college keep check on each and every payment of bills from the funds of different heads of the college. External audit: The external audit of government funds is done by the Local Audit committee/office of the Accountant General of Himachal Pradesh. The audit of HEIS funds and the funds of Self-financed Courses is done through registered Chartered Accountant.

The college follows the strategies for mobilisation of funds and optimal utilization of resources as directed by Govt. of H.P. The major fund providing agencies are UGC, H.P. University, H.P. Govt., RUSA grants, Self-Financing Courses (HEIS) and different student funds. The funds received are utilized to create better infrastructural facilities and academic environment. For major expenses, approval from Government is taken after recommendation from Staff Council Committees. The IQAC is actively functioning with a thrust on academic, co-academic and administrative excellence. IQAC has been made an integral part of the institution for quality improvement and sustenance and making efforts to develop a system of conscious, consistent and catalytic improvement in the performance of the college. The IQAC has made some contribution in formulating and implementing the strategies for quality improvement in the college and is also helping in achieving academic and co-academic excellence. The IQAC is also doing efforts to create, promote and encourage the kind of atmosphere conducive to carry out the different activities in the college in a phased manner. The college has made some incremental improvements in almost all areas in the post accreditation of second cycle in 2013. Employment oriented, Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) degree course in two streams i.e. Retail Management and Hospitality & Tourism has been started in the college from the academic session 2017-18. With the advent of this course, student visibility has increased in the development sector and industries. As an outcome of

the Students' feedback regarding infrastructure, mapping of college facilities has been done and classrooms, common rooms, hostels and washrooms have been renovated. The provisions for wireless connectivity (Wi-Fi), more books in the library, napkin vending machines in the girls toilets has been done in the campus. Multipurpose hall has been constructed for pursuing co-curricular and extra-curricular activities by the students.

7. Innovative Practices

The College has a zero tolerance policy towards sexual Harassment of Women at workplace sexual and any such transgression. The college is committed to provide a safe and conducive work and academic environment to students and its employees and is extremely alert to matters pertaining to any kind of harassment and gender sensitivity. Anti-ragging Committee is formed as per the U.G.C. guidelines. The college has consistently strived to address contemporary issues like gender, women concerns, safety and security etc. through its activities in the campus. Regular counselling of girl students is being done by the Principal and the Faculty members in classrooms/tutorials related to their issues of safety like self-defence, cyber-crime, police training and so on. The CCTV cameras have been installed in both the campuses to check and ensure security and safety of girls. There are two girls common rooms (one in old campus and one in new campus) in the college. There are separate toilets for gents, teaching staff and students. Girls toilets in the two common rooms and girls hostel, have been equipped with sanitary napkin vending machines and incinerators to promote the personal hygiene among the college girls. There is one hostel each for boys and girls where spacious Common rooms are available. The waste material in college is segregated into biodegradable and non-biodegradable wastes, and as toxic and non-toxic wastes in the laboratories. Indiscriminate use of chemicals is discouraged during practical classes and college does not have permission to use radioactive substances in its laboratories. The College adopts the policy of Reduce, Recycle and Reuse (3Rs). Organic floriculture is done on campus to sensitize students on sustainable

floricultural/agricultural practices. The college has undertaken an initiative of 'Green Campus' aimed at transformation of campus from dependency to sustainability with respect to water resources. The Rain Water Harvesting project is an attempt in this direction. The college observes and exercises the Green practices like-use of public transport for transportation, under Green landscaping plantation of trees and plants, online filing of examination forms, etc. Various activities such as tree plantation programmes, slogan writing, poster making competitions, afforestation drives, vanamahotsava, seminars and micro literacy camps etc. are also organised in the college. National festivals and birth/death anniversaries of great Indian personalities are celebrated. The expenditure incurred are properly scrutinized by local audit agency of H.P. Govt., HPAG Shimla and authorized Chartered Accountant (CA). The College also ensures transparency regarding financial management and resource mobilization through the Bursar and the Head of the Institution. The financial details and documents are properly scrutinized and maintained.

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





i) Curricular Aspects: - Govt. College Bhoranj is affiliated to

H.P. University, it follows the university designed curriculum. The college operates at UG level keeping in view our goals and objectives, that is, to make every student employable through holistic education and development of life skills. The University frames an academic calendar that specifies the duration of semester, the date of commencement of semester and the end semester examination. From the session 2018-19, annual system has been introduced in all faculties i.e. BA, BSc, BCom except BCA. The college circulates this academic calendar through prospectus and various notices. The college admits students in various faculties on the basis of merit according to the schedule provided by the University.

Academic Flexibility in terms of time is valuable for the students to complete their programme of study as per the norms of Himachal Pradesh University. Flexibility to the students to move from one discipline to another is there. The college allows a change from one discipline to another within the time frame of one month. Flexibility to pursue the programmes with reference to the time frame is in the purview of University rules. The college offers self-finance programmes at UG level.

The College provides Library and e-Learning facility (INFLIBNET) to the students as well as faculty members to update themselves.

ii) Teaching – Learning & Evaluation Admission to various programmes at UG level is done by a transparent and efficient administrative Mechanism, complying with all the norms of the state Govt. and University. The students admitted to the govt. college Bhoranj have heterogeneous background. Students represent different Geographical, socio-economic, and cultural background. The entry of the new entrant is made comfortable by counseling them and guiding them.

Teachers are fully aware of their accountability in teaching learning process. Midterm test is conducted to assess the performance of the students in the class. Hands on practice are given to the students in all the practical subjects. The college maintains study centric and student centric atmosphere in the campus. The college staff has outstanding scholars in their field of study. The University conducts Refresher courses/ Orientation programmes through UGC academic staff college for the benefit of the faculty members. The College sends the faculty to Faculty Development Programmes and quality improvement programmes. Seminars are further organized to disseminate the inputs gained in the above mentioned programmes. Teachers update their knowledge through various training programmes and faculty development programmes in various institutes. From Academic Session 2018-19, a new post of Computer Applications has been created and faculty has joined.

iv) Infrastructure and learning Resources:

Infrastructure is the key factor in the teaching learning process. The college has 17 class rooms, 09 Labs, 05 smart Class rooms and one examination hall. Keeping in view the recent development in teaching techniques college has spent significant amount for the upgraded technology. College has 64 computers and 06 broadband connections from NME-ICT scheme of Ministry of Human Resource development. The Library has access to INFLIBNET learning resource. Our computer and information technology lab is well equipped with LCD and help in facilitating teaching learning process. A grant of Rs. 2 crore under the RUSA system infrastructure grants has been sanctioned for the development of infrastructure in the college. The college has received and utilized Rs. 1crore and 80 lakhs so far. One conference hall and faculty cabins are made available for use. New buildings for the residence of the staff have been constructed with a cost of Rs. 1 crore 20 lakh. Canteen building with an estimate of Rs. 55.5 lakhs has been constructed. The grant of Rs. 2,17,916/- has been accorded in favor of our college during the session for the purchase of science material from the Directorate of Higher Education Shimla (H.P). Principal residence has been completed and one type I quarter residence shall also be completed soon ,as the amount has already been deposited with the Public Works Department of H.P. Government. College laboratories are equipped with all the facilities required for the students for hands on practice at UG level. The college has one health Gymnasium. The playground of the college is under construction and sum of Rs 4 crores have been spent for the purpose and the work is in progress. Laboratories of Zoology, Botany and Geography are equipped with Podium and projector for smart teaching practices.

4. Steps taken by the college to improve the quality of Education with regard to following quality parameters of NAAC for the college:-

I. Curricular Aspects: - Completed the syllabus (all subjects) in time by following lesson plans within a stipulated time and revision of the more important topics. A workshop on cyber crime was organized in the college on 21st July 2018. Programmes on drug de-addiction, surgical strikes, Disaster management were held during the session 2018-19 and essay writing competition, poster- making & slogan writing competitions were held on this occasion.

II. Teaching -Learning & Evaluation: - Teachers use various techniques of teaching while more emphasis is laid on lecture method and ensure participation of students, Assignments and project works are given to students regularly. Regular class test brains storming exercises and case studies are given to students for deep understanding of the subject. While evaluating class test and house test, suggestions are given to students to enhance their performance in a more effective way. Some teachers are also sent for evaluation at the designated evaluation centres.

III. Research, Consultancy & Extension: - Students are given the knowledge of various research techniques like collection of primary and secondary data, making of questionnaire, taking interviews and how to use this information for presentation of research report.

IV. Infrastructure and learning Resources: - Presently the college is functioning from the premises of Govt. SSS Ramshehar. Presently the college has its own Wi-Fi facility and four computers and these are being used for doing practical work of subject like Commerce and providing internet accessibility to the students for study purpose. Additional resources will be provided to the students when college will shift to its own building. However, the resources at the disposal of college are being fully utilized for academic development and sports and extracurricular activities in the college.

V. Student Support and Progression: - Students are given motivational lecture for their overall development of their personalities by the faculty. The college carrier counseling cell also provides information regarding various job opportunities by inviting resource persons from industries and national skills development centre. Counseling and guidance classes are also

conducting to create awareness regarding various soft skills and various courses required for getting job opportunities in the changing global scenario.

VI. Governance and Leadership: - Students CSCA was constituted during the session 2018-19 on merit basis as per university CSCA notification. student CSCA representatives were consulted with regard to various students welfare activities. Matters relating to student welfare were decided by the CSCA. Thus college CSCA is an organization that enables students to learn governance and leadership.

VII. Innovative Practices: - The college has been using IT for teaching, learning and Project-making. All the important days of national and international importance are observed in the college. On these days various activities like essay writing, slogan writing debate and declamation are held for the overall development of students. These activities seem to be a boom for the holistic development of students of this institution.

College prospectus was published. About 160 students applied for the financial help from various scholar ship schemes under state and central governments. Medical facilities were also provided for the students. The poor and meritorious needy students were provided fees concession through PTA fund. A book bank has been made in the college library for their help. A skill development course“ IT and IT enabled services” was started in the college under skill development programme of H.P. Kaushal Vikas Nigam. A placement drive was organised for the students of this course through which 23 students were placed in various companies of which 5 students joined the job. Rozgar Mela was organised by the college through which 5 students were recruited by a Chandigarh based company ANV Solutions Ltd. A woman redressal cell looked after the problems faced by the girl students.

vi) Governance and leadership:

The college functioned through the formation of various administrative committees. Formulation of action plans were decided in the meetings with PTA, CSCA,OSA, the college Advisory and IQAC cell. The college as per the abilities and aptitudes gave leadership assignment to the students and the teachers. The best among the NSS and NCC were given the roles of NSS office bearer(President,VicePresident,GeneralSecretary,Joint Secretary) and NCC under officer respectively. Similar practice was adopted to assign leadership role to the students in other domains.

कंप्यूटर लैब:



5. Steps taken by the College to improve the quality of education with regard to the following quality parameters of NAAC for the college-

- **Curricular Aspects-** The college implements the curriculum framed by Himachal Pradesh University. Depending on the resources and institutional goals, the college makes an effort to impart quality education. It follows structured and well planed techniques for effective delivery of the curriculum. Regular departmental meetings with the respective heads were held to discuss action plans for smooth and productive teaching. The faculty prepared lesson plans well in advance with course objectives, content and topics, teaching aids, teaching hours, reference books and teaching outcomes. It provided an insight for effective teaching. Regular feedback was obtained from students and faculty members with an objective of improving overall efficiency of the institution. The academic calendar was prepared and internal assessment schedules were communicated to the students well in advance.
- ii) Teaching-Learning & Evaluation** - The college offers graduate degree, post graduate and honours programmes with emphasis on Audio-visual Aids, Group Discussions, Peer Teaching, Debates, Tests, Seminars, PPT's, Paper Presentation, Role Play, Quiz, Book

Reviews, Screening of Documentaries, Field Surveys, Peer Teaching, etc. The college uses modern teaching methods and ICT in teaching-learning. E-learning was encouraged, whereby the students accessed the internet for their personal assignments and projects. Class tests were conducted every month and regular discussions and seminars were also held. Tutorials and remedial classes were held for weak students and slow learners. The teachers of the college participated actively in all the academic activities of the college and the University. They were appointed as paper setters, evaluators and examiners. The academic calendar was prepared and internal assessment schedules were communicated to the students well in advance. Number of extension and outreach programmes were conducted in collaboration with industry, community and Non- Government Organisations through NSS/NCC/Red cross/Youth Red Cross (YRC) etc., during the year. Swachh Bharat Abhiyan, Tree Plantation, Blood donation Camp, Youth Parliament, NSS Camp, Gandhi Jayanti Celebration, Talk on Drug free Himachal, Mental Health Programme were organized during the year.

iii) Research, Consultancy & Extension- National/ International Conferences/ seminars/ workshops were organized by the college. Faculty members were regularly updated about research projects and conferences and granted leave for workshops and seminars and were encouraged for writing research papers and for formulating major/minor research projects.

- A National Science Seminar was organized on ‘Let’s Frolic with the Technoplenum by the Department of Computer Science
- An International Seminar ‘Partition Revisited’ was organised by the Departments of Political Science and History.
- A Regional Seminar by SEBI was organized by Placement Cell.
- A One-day Workshop was organized by Science faculty in collaboration with Jaypee University Waknaghat.
- A Workshop on National Securities Depository Limited was organized by the Department of Economics and Commerce.

iv) Infrastructure and Learning Resources- The infrastructure of the college is being augmented to keep pace with the academic growth through grant from the state government and UGC. The college has adequate class rooms, smart rooms, a seminar

hall and well equipped research laboratories with sophisticated instruments and computer labs with internet facilities. Apart from these an automated Library, administrative building, indoor sports complex, canteen, herbal garden, language lab, green house, paper recycling unit and vermicomposting unit, common room, are available in the campus. Other facilities such as scanner, printer and photocopy machines are provided in each department. The college has provided individual rooms for each department. The infrastructure facilities are disabled-friendly. Ramps facilitate access to the classrooms and labs in all departments.

- v) **Student Support and Progression** - The college has a well-established student mentoring and support system. Faculty members counsel the students during admissions, during and after classes and during value education classes on issues related to the subject, student problems, and advise them on issues related to academic, placement, industrial training and career goals. One of our student Diksha Vashisht, B.A. IInd year completed an intensive residential English Language and communication internship at the summer camp in Russia. Apart from classroom interaction the students are encouraged to participate in different technical and other co-curricular events held on campus or anywhere else in the country. The college also has facilities for indoor games besides outdoor games. The college has a regular Placement Cell & Career Guidance cell which provides career guidance, training and placement to the students. The college provide scholarships to SC/ST, OBC students as per government schemes and guidelines. The college also has a Book Bank facility. Remedial classes are held for slow learners and each department invites several experts from different institutions to interact with the students. Some departments of the college organize industrial trips for the students. At least 98 percent of our students go for higher studies in their respective areas of interest. Our students are also working efficiently in various reputed organisations.

- vi) **Governance and Leadership**- There is an IQAC committee in which all the important decisions regarding the functioning of the college are taken with the participation of management as well as staff members. IQAC, being the heart of the college functioning involves alumni, parents as well as students as its members to show their effective participation in making important decisions for the college. There

are committees like Parent-Teacher Association (PTA) in which the President is elected from amongst the parents and who represents the parents as stakeholders and gives their valuable suggestions in promoting the effective functioning of the College. Student Council formation takes place in a democratic manner through elections choosing the Admiral, Vice-Admiral, Captains and Vice Captains of the respective ships. The Council takes responsibility of accomplishing all the tasks of the College as directed by the staff and the management. Further, other committees like the Anti-Ragging Committee, Grievance Redressal Cell, Women Anti-Harassment Cell, College Societies, RUSA Committee, Library Committee, and Academic monitors are also formed to effectively implement the decentralized form of working by giving appropriate participation of every stakeholder.

E-Commerce: An Add-on Course in the subject of E-Commerce has been started since August 2018 as per the guidelines of Dean-cum-Director, College Development Council, HPU, Shimla with the objective of competitive edge to the students in die hard professionally competitive scenario. EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Government Degree College Matour is a rural college, which started with 466 students offering B.A. and B.Com. Pass courses in the year 2017. Today the College has 859 students of which 70 percent are girl students and 7 faculty members. There is also an efficient team of non-teaching and support staff. At present the College offers undergraduate courses in Humanities and Commerce disciplines only.

I. Curricular Aspects

Government Degree College Matour follows the curriculum prescribed by the HPU Shimla. The College has an innovative approach towards the curriculum. It supports and encourages constant improvisation in the pedagogical practices and teaching methodologies to optimize curriculum delivery and maintain a consistently high standard of education. The faculty is actively involved in the curriculum development of University, as members of academic bodies and subject experts of curriculum revision committees. They organize seminars, workshops and talks by eminent speakers on academic and curriculum-related issues and interface with industry, media houses, research bodies, and other educational institutions to facilitate and augment the curriculum. This takes our educational enterprise beyond the classroom and in the process equips our students with valuable life-skills to cope with the challenges of the world outside. They also provide counselling on the curriculum to the students as well as mentor them through regular tutorials curricular enrichment and also facilitated through involvement in extracurricular activities. In addition to the discipline specific Associations of each department, the College has a number of societies for extra-curricular activities and Eco club for environment awareness. These enrich the understanding of different curricular pursuits on gender, climate change, environmental education, cultural values, human-rights and justice, among others, while providing ample opportunities to students to discover and hone their individual talents and aptitudes. Government Degree College Matour's Internal Quality Assurance Cell as well as Staff Council and department meetings regularly assess the feedback and make their suggestions for institutional improvement.

II. Teaching-Learning & Extension

The aim of the College is to provide all-round education that focuses on the intellectual, social, emotional, aesthetic and spiritual development of every student so that they engage with the world as citizen of substance. For this Government Degree College Matour purpose there is an effort to constantly reinvent and adopt innovative pedagogical techniques. High demand ratios for all programmes can be attributed to consistently campus discipline and general atmosphere conducive to learning. The College has a transparent admission procedure. The admission form, prospectus and percentage cut-off lists of all departments are available on the College website. Under the tutor-ward system, the teacher is available within the College premises and students can approach him/her with their personal, academic and career related problems.

V. Student Support and Progression

Book bank facility, fee concession, students' aid fund and scholarships and prizes are given by the College to the students. The prizes are merit based and given for excellence in the field of academics, curricular and extracurricular activities providing support and incentive to students to do their best. The College has an Equal Opportunity Cell which looks after the interests of the students with special needs. A Grievance Redressal Cell, Anti-Ragging Committee, Committee for Prevention of Caste Based Discrimination and Committee for Prevention of Sexual Harassment ensure a conducive and secure environment for growth and development of students. 4.1 Curricular Aspects

College has adopted the curricula framed by HP University. The curricula offers diversity and flexibility to learners by providing them opportunities to study a number of subjects. At present, this college is offering Arts and Commerce streams to the students. The college is affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University Shimla for both the streams. The members of Board of Studies are nominated from amongst the faculty of affiliated colleges. The Board undertakes the task of revising the curriculum from time to time. The affiliated colleges on their own have no role in changing the curricular however committees of college teachers work out the requisite changes and improvements and send them to the chairman of the Board of Studies for consideration

4.2 Teaching-Learning and evaluation

To understand the comprehension level of students, student's feedback is taken bimonthly. It also helps teachers to have their self assessment. During the lecture, active learning is encouraged by asking questions or by recalling the prior material, to maintain their focus. College staff is easily accessible. Different interactive activities like debate, quiz competition, slogan writing, poster making, culture programs etc. are organized to enhance communication among students and teachers of different faculties. Teachers of the college use different methods of teaching to deliver the course contents effectively. The college has highly qualified and competent faculty members. Most of them hold M. Phil degrees and two of them hold Ph.D. degree. Internal assessment of all graduate courses is given as per the CBCS guidelines laid down by the university.

4.3 Research, Consultancy and Extension

Dr. Rajneesh Sharma Assistant Professor (Commerce) has presented paper on topic "Digital India" in the National seminar on "Progression for Brilliance in Commerce, Mangement and Economics at GDC Jukhala on 1st Oct. 2018.

Dr. Raj Kumar has presented his paper at 51th Session of Punjab History Conference at Punjabi University Patiala and in Haryana History Congress at Starex University Gurugram on respective topics **Life and Achievements of Maharaja Sansar Chand Katoch of Kangra, 1775-1823, Ideology and Objectives of Colonial Forestry in India.**

Although the college does not conduct formal research courses, efforts are made to inculcate a spirit of enquiry and scientific temperament among students by encouraging undertaking assignments/projects of analytical nature pertaining to their courses of study under the guidance of the faculty. They are also encouraged to make presentations and participate in seminars and debates to enable them to hone their analytic and presentation skills. There is no provision for financial assistance for research projects by the students. In fact, the projects assigned to the students are a regular part of their curriculum and do not entail much expenditure. Regular scholarships are however provided to the needy students/students from backward communities by the state government and other agencies. 52 (fifty two) students have applied for various types of scholarships in the session 2017-18.

4.4 Infrastructure and Learning Resources

The College is being run in the premises of Govt. Senior Secondary School Dhaneta. A separate building of GSSS Dhaneta having 8 Rooms have been occupied by the college since session 2016-17. At present there are 5 teaching Rooms/Library, one staff room, one ministerial and Principal office is available. All rooms have been well equipped. The land has been selected for the college premises and the efforts are being made to complete the codal formalities with the collaboration of Revenue department. In near future the college will shift in the building of GZS college Dhaneta Distt. Hamirpur which is merged in this college.

4.5 Student support and progression

College has a women's grievances redressal and appellate cell, a committee against sexual harassment, discipline and anti-ragging committee, RUSA /IQAC committee and a career guidance cell. College provides detailed information and counseling the students at the time of admission and further various information regarding competitive exams are given through career guidance cell. College publishes its prospectus cum handbook of information annually to provide various kinds of information to the students related to general rules/regulations of the college and university. Various scholarships are awarded to SC/ST/OBC/economically weaker section/girls and meritorious students, as provided by the government. The students are encouraged to participate in co-curricular activities including inter college sports and HPU youth festival events. The half unit of NSS is working in this session and Rover and Ranger units are also functional. Eco-Club and Election Literacy Club have been established. College provides a platform to young writers of the college. College magazine "Dhanashri" is being published by the college every year. In addition to this various societies like literary society, social science society and commerce society conduct various activities.

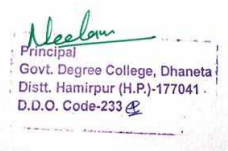
4.6 Governance and Leadership

A Bursar has been appointed to ensure the best use of available funds. Regular audit of funds is conducted by the Local Audit department.

4.7 Innovative practices

The college has adopted many healthy practices in its day to day working. It has sensitized to the latest management concepts like team work and participative management. Regular staff meetings, PTA meetings and interactions with students' representative body (CSCA) contribute to the means of internal quality checks. Educational tours and field study tours are organized by different departments. Members of teaching staff go for orientation programme, refresher courses and other induction training and skill development training programme. Energy saving strategies are being adopted to save the electricity and water. Students are being encouraged to use natural lights, ventilation and preserve the natural sources of water.

Various creative events like Quiz, slogan writing, painting, essay writing, debate and declamation and poetry competitions etc. were organized during this academic year to create awareness about different topics, issues and challenges.
