1.	7.33	Nil	<p>In the First Ordinance of Himachal Pradesh University, Vol-I, New Chapter VII TITLED "Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) under UG Classes (Rules and Regulations thereof)" shall be added as under :</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>CHAPTER VII</u></p> <p style="text-align: center;"><u>MINIMUM COURSE CURRICULUM FOR UNDERGRADUATE COURSES UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM</u></p> <p>Background/Preamble:</p> <p>Education plays enormously significant role in building of a nation. There are quite a large number of educational institutions, engaged in imparting education in our country. Majority of them have entered recently into semester system to match with international educational pattern. However, our present education system is churning out youth who have to compete locally, regionally, nationally as well as globally. The present alarming situation necessitates transformation and/or redesigning of system, not only by introducing innovations but developing "learner-centric approach.</p> <p>Majority of Indian higher education institutions have been following the system which obstructs the flexibility for the students to study the subjects/courses of their choice and their mobility to different institutions. There is need to allow the flexibility in education system, so that students depending upon their interests can choose inter-disciplinary, intra-disciplinary and skill-based courses. This can only be possible when choice based credit system (CBCS), an internationally acknowledged system, is adopted. The choice based credit system not only offers opportunities and avenues to learn core subjects but also explore additional avenues of learning beyond the core</p>

For determining CCA following procedure shall be applicable:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> i) 5 marks for attendance. ii) 5 marks for class test to be taken on completion of 40% syllabus by the class teacher. iii) 10 marks for house test to be taken on completion of 75% of syllabus. iv) 10 marks for assignments, tutorials, general behavior of student. <p>6. The minimum passing marks will be 40% in aggregate. However, 35% each, in Internal Assessment and Final Examination will be compulsory, For Practical 40% passing marks will be Compulsory and if candidate fails to obtain 40% marks in practical will be treated as fail in that subject.</p> <p>A candidate failing in either one or two subjects/papers will be given compartment in that subjects/papers and will be eligible for promotion to the next class. He/She will appear in the subjects/papers in the subject/paper in which He/She will have two chances (one at the supplementary stage and one at annual stage), available to him to clear his/her compartment in subjects/papers, failing which he/she shall be declared fail and shall be required to repeat the entire year/class. He/She will not be awarded the degree until he/she clears all his/her courses within five years from the date of his/her admission to a particular course. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and has to repeat the entire year.</p> <p>7. The successful candidates will be classified on the combined results of the PART-I,II,III examination as follows:</p> <p>First Division: 60% marks or more in the aggregate</p> <p>Second Division: 50% marks but less than 60%</p>
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
