The Learning Outcomes for Students of the M.A. English Course at CDOE, HPU Shimla

1. Understand English Literature

Students learn to read and understand stories, poems, and plays written in English. They know what the writer is trying to say and how the story or poem is made. This learning helps students become teachers, work in publishing, or work with books and reading materials.

2. Know Literary History

8. Use Literary Theories

Students are introduced to simple ideas from great critics like Aristotle, Derrida, and Showalter. These ideas help students look at literature in new and thoughtful ways. This knowledge is useful for those who want to do PhD, research, or college-level teaching.

9. Improve Speaking Skills

Learners practice how to speak clearly and with confidence during class discussions and seminars. They learn to explain their thoughts on books and ideas. This skill is helpful for interviews, teaching jobs, and public speaking tasks.

10. Prepare for Careers or Exams

This MA course gives students the knowledge and training needed for exams like NET, SET, and other competitive tests. It also helps them get ready for teaching, research, higher studies, or jobs that require strong English skills.
