D) General Information

1. Number of seats, eligibility, basis of admission, age limit, reservation, fee structure, scheme of examination and qualifying marks will be as per the University rules as prescribed in the Himachal Pradesh University Ordinance and Handbook of Information from time to time.

II Scheme of Courses: Three Categories of Courses are as follows:

1. Discipline Specific Core Compulsory Courses (14 Core Courses; {Core})
2. Discipline Specific Elective Courses (2 Elective Courses; {DSE})
3. Generic Elective Courses (2 Generic Elective; {GE})

A student is required to complete **four** Core Courses each in Semesters I and II, and **three** Core Courses, **one** Elective Course and **one** Generic Elective (GE) each in Semesters II and IV.

The number & type of courses to be completed in each semester is as follows:

III Scheme of Examination

Each Course shall be of 100 marks and qualifying marks in each Course shall be 40 marks.

- i) For **regular students**, the distribution of 100 marks shall be 80 for Theory and 20 for Internal Assessment. The Internal Assessment of 20 marks shall comprise of: Attendance = 5marks, Assignments/ Presentation =5 marks, Internal Examinations = 10 marks.

Marks for attendance is given as per the following criterion:

75% to 80%	:	1 Mark
81% to 85%	:	2 Marks
86% to 90%	:	3 Marks
91% to 95%	:	4 Marks
96% to 100%	:	5 Marks

- ii) In case of students of Distance Education, i.e., **ICDEOL**, the distribution of 100 marks shall be 80 for Theory and 20 for Internal Assessment. This Internal Assessment of 20 marks shall be based on compulsory assignments submitted by the students in each Course in each Semester.
- iii) In case of **Private Students**, each Course shall be of 100 marks and there will be no internal assessment/compulsory assignments.
- iv) The syllabus for each course comprise of 4 sections with five units.

Pattern of Testing:

Compulsory question consists of 08 short answer questions of 2 marks each, i.e., total 16 marks. Four long answers questions carry 16 marks per unit, i.e., total 64 marks.
