SYLLABUS

(Rules/Guidelines/Faculty & Papers)

Name of the Course: Post Graduate Diploma in Ambedkar Studies

Duration of the Course and Examinations:

- (i) The duration of the Post Graduate Diploma in Ambedkar Studies shall be one academic year. Examination shall be held at the end of the year ordinarily in the month of May/June. The dates are to be notified by the Controller of Examinations.
- (ii) The examination shall consist of five papers. Out of five papers four shall be theory papers and fifth paper shall be Project work. The syllabi shall be as prescribed by the Faculty of Social Sciences from time to time.
- (iii) The medium of instructions and examinations shall be English or Hindi.
- (iv) Each paper will be of 100 marks maximum. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be 40% in each theory paper. The Project work will be of 100 marks fifty marks will be awarded through internal evaluation and other fifty marks will be for viva—voce to be conducted by the external examiner. The minimum number of marks required to pass the examination shall be 50% in Project work and the candidate has to pass separately in internal and external evaluations by securing minimum fifty per cent marks in each. The minimum number of total marks required to pass the examination shall be 45% marks in aggregate in all the papers.
- (v) The candidates shall be required to attend 75% of the classes.
- (vi) The pass candidates shall be classified as under:-
- (a) First Division: those students who obtain 60% or more of the aggregate marks. A candidate obtaining 75% or more of the aggregate marks shall be shown to have passed the examination with distinction.
- (b) Second Division: those students who obtain 50% or more marks but less than 60% of the aggregate marks.
- (c) Third Division: all those students who pass the examination obtaining 45% or less than 50% marks out of the aggregate will be classified in third Division.

Eligibility for Admission

A Bachelor's degree in any Faculty of a University established by Law in India including Shastri & Vashist Shastri or any degree equivalent to Bachelor's degree

OR

Degree of a Foreign University which may be recognized as an equivalent for the purpose by the Vice-Chancellor.

Number of Seats: 40 (Forty), which can be varied as per rules in the University.

Faculty: Keeping in view multi-disciplinary nature of the course, the Faculty will be invited guest teachers from concerned fields on the pattern of already running Post Graduate Diploma in Deen Dayal Upadhyaya Thought.
