## Report on Debate Competition

### Topic: *“People are Trusting AI”*

The Technical Club successfully organized a debate competition on the thought-provoking topic **“People are Trusting AI”** on **18 March 2026** in the Department of Data Science and Artificial Intelligence. Students from the department enthusiastically participated in the event and presented insightful arguments both in favor of and against the motion. The debate provided an interactive platform for students to express their views on the growing influence of Artificial Intelligence in modern society.

Participants speaking in favor of the motion highlighted how AI has transformed various sectors by improving efficiency, automation, communication, healthcare, education, and decision-making processes. They discussed how AI-powered technologies have become an integral part of daily life, making tasks easier and increasing productivity.
